### Are you a good person?

Many people think they are good because they compare themselves with others who have done obviously bad things. Here's the "Good Person Test":

YES	NO	Have you ever told a lie? (Even a little one counts.)
YES	NO	Do you always respect and obey your parents?
YES	NO	Have you ever stolen something? Even a small thing counts.
YES	NO	Have you ever wanted what someone else has with envy?

These questions touch on only four of the Ten Commandments that God gave us (Exodus 20 & Deuteronomy 5). If you had to say "yes" to even one of the questions above, then you didn't pass the test because someone who breaks God's rules has sinned. Yes. We all have. The Bible says, "There is no one righteous, not even one;" (Romans 3:10 NIV). When sinners die they will be separated from God and sent to Hell -- a terrible firey place. That's very serious!

The Bible says, "the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." (Romans 6:23, NIV)

Jesus is the only son of God, but He came to this world, lived a perfect life. He never sinned, but jealous and angry people killed Jesus on a cross. Jesus didn't have to let them kill Him, but He did because He was dying to pay for the sins of everyone else--you and me (Romans 5:8). We have broken God's rules--the Ten Commandments--but Jesus paid our fine for sin by dying on the cross. His blood paid for our sins.

Isn't that nice to know all that? It is, but knowing something isn't enough. For information to help us, we have to use it. We need to be forgiven of our sins. This is how we can use what know Jesus did for us:

- 1) Admit that you need a Savior. Ask God to forgive you for your sins. (1 John 1:9)
- 2) **Believe** Jesus died on the cross, and that God raised Him from the dead.
- 3) **Confess** that Jesus is your Lord -- the owner in charge of your life. (Romans 10:9)

Now, with Jesus in charge you should live differently and not keep doing the things that break God's rules. (2 Corinthians 5:17) For example, if you say, "I follow Jesus." but you keep lying on purpose. You're not really following Jesus. We won't be perfect or be able to do all this on our own, but with Jesus in charge of our lives our desire is to do the right things. With Jesus' help we can! (Romanos 10:13) Here are some ideas to help as you follow Jesus:

- > Read or listen to the Bible
- > Do what the Bible says. Jesus said, "If you love me, keep my commands." (John 14:15, NIV)
- > Talk with God about everything and ask Him for help.
- > Participate in a church where they teach the Bible.
- > Share with others what what Jesus did for you so they can know too!


# The Books of the Old Testament



"Cain, why do you look so upset and angry?" God asked


"Do what is right, because sin wants to destroy you."

Enoch enjoyed being with God and spending time with Him. We can imagine that Enoch liked walking with God, listening to Him, praying and talking with God.



God took Enoch because he was faithful and walked with Him.



Noah did what was right, but the rest of the people did not. They did terrible, violent things and kept sinning against God.


God was sad about how the people He loved had turned out. He wanted things to be better.


God saw that Noah did right and chose to obey Him. So, God told Noah about the great flood that was coming to wash away the evil people. God gave Noah


#### **The Tower of Babel**

After Noah's Flood, God told the people to multiply and spread out over the earth to fill it up again, but they didn't want to do what He said.



They started the project in a place called Shinar. They were making good progress on their tower when God came to visit. He saw that they were all working together, but they were not obeying Him.


"If they keep going with this unity, nothing will be impossible for them," God said.




The Bible says that God heard Ishmael's cries and He answered. An angel showed Hagar a well of water and promised that God would make Ishmael's family grow and become a nation.

"Escape for your lives!" said the angels. "The Lord is going to destroy the city!"



Genesis 37


"Did you see Joseph's new coat?" said Simeon. "For sure, he is Dad's favorite."




Even in the prison, God was with Joseph.
